No.	Botanical Name	Common Name	Origin	Label Text
	<i>Abutilon</i> (orange)			An evergreen shrub 2-3mH x 1-2mW. Lovely red and yellow flowers throughout the year. Best in full sun. Prune after flowering to promote a bushy habit. Bird attracting.
	<i>Acacia victoriae</i>	Wattle	NSW, NT, Qld, SA, Vic.,WA	A large rounded evergreen shrub to 3mHx 3mW with pale yellow wattle balls in summer. Medium to heavy soils in an open, sunny position. Drought and frost resistant. Seeds are edible and available commercially, ground and used in cooking, scones, icecream etc.
	<i>Adenanthos x cunninghamii</i>	Small Albany woolly bush	Western Aust.	Was once thought to be a species but now is believed to be a natural hybrid of two <i>Adenanthos</i> species. Small red flowers throughout the year. Bird attracting. A great lower-growing woollybush. Light, well-drained soil in an open sunny position. Frost tender.
	<i>Aloe zebrinae</i>			A succulent with leaves clustered into a rosette with interesting white markings on the leaves and tall flower spikes. Drought tolerant and will rarely need watering. Needs full sun.
	<i>Alyxia ruscifolia</i>		NSW & Qld.	This species is a shrub to around 2mH but can get taller. Produces sweetly scented white flowers in spring and summer. Orange berries in autumn. Originates from moist areas so needs constant moisture to do its best. Frost resistant but drought tender.
	<i>Aquilegia vulgaris</i>	Granny's bonnet	Europe	A species of columbine. Herbaceous perennial growing to 1.2m tall with flowers in various colours.
	<i>Araucaria bidwillii</i>	Bunya pine	Queensland, Australia	Tall evergreen conifer from the Jurassic period to 40mH x 10mW. Medium to heavy well-drained soil in a protected position whilst young. Bears large, heavy cones to 7kg with edible nuts. Timber valued by cabinet makers and for acoustic guitar soundboards. Frost resistant and drought tender. For large gardens or parks or as a container plant.
	<i>Begonia cv.</i>			Good indoor plants with attractive leaves and pink flowers.
	<i>Backhousia citriodora</i>	Lemon myrtle	Queensland	An evergreen tree which can grow to 15m in Queensland but can be pruned to a shrub if desired or grown in a pot in a courtyard. Profuse clusters of white flowers in spring and summer. Requires medium to heavy soil in a well-drained, sunny but protected position. Leaves are often used for flavouring food and drinks.
	<i>Brillantaisia ulugurica</i>			A long-flowering plant with striking purple flower spikes in summer. It needs some protection in winter. Full sun or part-shade in our climate and prune flower heads after flowering. Can reach 1.5-3m in height.
	<i>Brachyscome multifida</i>	Cutleaf daisy Rock daisy	NSW, Qld., Vic.	A small, hardy perennial plant to 0.3m x 0.4m with blue daisy flowers in spring and summer. Light to medium soils in a protected sunny position. Drought and frost resistant. Suited to pots, borders. Butterfly attracting.
	<i>Buckinghamia celcissima</i>	Ivory Curl Tree	Queensland	Medium-sized evergreen tree to 7-8m in cultivation, with dark green foliage and spectacular racemes of cream flowers in summer to early winter. Suited to most well-drained soils and

				conditions but frost and drought tender.
	<i>Buddleja davidii</i>	Butterfly bush	China	An evergreen tree or shrub to 5mH x 3mW with arching branches and fragrant scented lilac flowers in long terminal spikes in summer. Adaptable to most soils and conditions and drought and frost resistant.
	<i>Buddleja davidii</i> "Dwarf crimson"			A wonderful selection of a lower-growing butterfly attracting bush. Produces scented flowers throughout the year on a bushy habit. Prune after flower to encourage new flowers. Very hardy in sun or shade.
	<i>Bursaria spinosa</i>	SA Christmas bush	Southern Australia	An evergreen shrub with panicles of attractive white flowers in summer and autumn. Acid to mildly alkaline soil in sun or dappled shade. Uses: Screen, butterfly-attracting.
	<i>Buxus microphylla var. japonica</i>	Japanese box		A compact evergreen shrub which can be used as a formal or informal hedge, barrier or screen. Can be pruned as a low border or left as background screen. Leaves turn bronze in winter.
	<i>Callitris gracilis</i>	Southern Cypress Pine	Australia	A long-lived tree 5 to 15m tall depending on conditions. Slow-growing initially. Light, well-drained soil. Drought resistant. Open position. Seeds are popular with Rosellas.
	<i>Camptotheca acuminata</i>		China & Tibet	A medium sized deciduous tree which can reach 20m in height with the right conditions. The new leaves are a bright red in colour. The bark and stems contain the alkaloid camptothecin, a compound being researched for cancer treatment.
	<i>Canna warscewiczii</i>		Costa Rica & Brazil	A species of Canna with lovely foliage and striking red flowers in summer. Prefers a reasonably moist soil that holds good moisture level, is not cold hardy and requires some protection in winter. A group makes a great show in the summer garden.
	<i>Chrysanthemum</i> "Buninyong Bronze"			A perpetual flowering Chrysanthemum that will flower from Spring to Autumn. It will produce masses of orange/red flowers with a yellow centre. Requires full sun and can be used as a cut flower. Dead head after flowering to keep bushy.
	<i>Chrysanthemum x morifolium</i>	Florist Chrysanthemum		This selection has tight yellow buds that appear in autumn. Can be used in the perennial garden and is also an excellent cut flower. Flowers best in full sun. Cut to the ground in late winter.
	<i>Cornus alba var. sibirica</i>	Red stemmed Dogwood		An erect, bushy, deciduous shrub to 1-3mH x 2mW with bright red stems in winter. Coppice every couple of years to keep the intense colour in the stems. The leaves also turn a bright purple in autumn. Flowers are white and appear in spring to summer. Needs full sun and grows in most soil types.
	<i>Correa backhousiana</i>		Tas.	Small to medium shrub approx.. 1.5m x 1.5m with creamy bell-shaped flowers in winter. Prefers well-drained soil in a morning sun or dappled shade position. Resistant to salt spray. Dislikes wet feet but needs some summer water in dry periods. Bird attracting.
	<i>Cupressus sempervirens</i>	Pencil pine	Mediterranean	A very long-lived species with very narrow growth and can eventually reach above 35m in height. Used in topiary designs, it responds well to regular pruning to maintain an attractive shape.
	<i>Deutzia gracilis</i> "Nikko"	Japanese snowflower	Japan	A graceful, compact low-growing semi-deciduous shrub to 60cm. with racemes of small white flowers in late spring, early summer. Suited to most soils. Needs some summer water. Sun or part-shade. Frost resistant once established.

	<i>Dianthus barbatus</i>	Sweet William	Europe	A small perennial plant with perfumed pinkish flowers in spring and summer. Prefers light to medium soil in an open, sunny position. Drought and frost resistant. Useful border plant.
	<i>Diospyros whyteana</i>	Bladder nut	S. Africa	An evergreen shrub to 5mH x 1.5-3mW with white/cream flowers from Autumn to Spring. Any well-drained soil. Drought resistant. Often used as a hedge. Grows well at Wittunga Botanic Garden.
	<i>Doryanthes palmeri</i>	Spear lily	Eastern Australia	A dense rosette of long arching leaves with a flower stalk reaching over 3m in height with masses of bright funnel-shaped flowers in summer. Striking accent plant, very effective for mass planting under trees in large-scale landscapes. Leaves useful in floral work.
	<i>Dyckia enchilioides</i>		S. Brazil	A succulent from the Bromeliad family with orange flowers in spring. 0.8m to 1m H. Full sun or light shade in well-drained sand or loam.
	<i>Eremophila maculata</i>	Emu bush	Australia	A neat, hardy, low to medium evergreen shrub with tubular spotted pinkish flowers from autumn to early summer. Suited to most soils. Warm sunny position. Drought hardy. Long-lived. Bird attracting.
	<i>Eremophila</i> "Summertime blue"	<i>E. divaricata x nivea</i>	Australia	Evergreen shrub to 2m x 2m with masses of lavender-blue flowers in summer. Well-drained clay or loam soils. Full sun to part shade. Needs little water after establishment on Adelaide plains. Clip lightly after flowering.
	<i>Euonymus fortunei x radicans</i>		China	
	<i>Felicia filifolia</i>		South Africa	A lovely member of the daisy family with smallish flowers that range from white to pink and mauve. Will grow to about 1mH x 1mW. Full sun. Prune after flowering to keep dense.
	<i>Fuchsia procumbens</i>	Trailing fuchsia	New Zealand	Prefers rich, moist soil in a shady, sheltered position.
	<i>Fuchsia coccinea</i>	Scarlet Fuchsia	Brazil	A fast-growing shrub that can vary in habit according to its habitat. In good conditions in shade it can grow up to 3.5mH, but can be pruned after flowering. It bears scarlet flowers, mainly in summer and requires fertile, well-drained neutral soil. Shade in summer is essential and may be beneficial most of the year in our climate. The fruit is edible. Frost and drought tender.
	<i>Gardenia sp.</i>			A wonderful perfumed shrub that produces pure white double flowers throughout the year. Does best with protection from sun, as well as the flowers. Sheltered position with neutral to acid soil. A great plant with a bushy habit for a pot.
	<i>Goodenia albiflora</i>		S. Australia	A hardy, low, evergreen shrub or groundcover to 0.5m high with white or pale lilac flowers in summer. Sun or part shade. Well-drained clay or light soils. Drought and frost resistant once established. An attractive groundcover which will gradually spread.
	<i>Goodenia ovata</i>		Australia	A hardy low-growing groundcover to .05m x 1m with golden yellow flowers in spring and summer. Quick-growing in most soils. Shade or morning sun. Frost hardy. Ideal for rockeries, edges, hanging baskets.
	<i>Goodenia varia</i>		Australia	Very hardy groundcover with yellow flowers most of the year. Sun or part shade. Suited to

				pots, hanging baskets, courtyards. Drought hardy.
	<i>Grevillea hilleana</i>	White Silky Oak	NSW & Qld	An evergreen tree to 20mH x 5mW in Queensland with white flowers in dense cylindrical clusters. Prefers well-composted soils in a protected, part-shaded position. May be drought and frost tender.
	<i>Heteropterys angustifolia</i>	Red Wings	South America	A rare shrubby climber approx.. 1.5-2m H with yellow flowers and showy red-winged fruits in summer to autumn. Best in moist, well-drained soil. Morning sun or semi-shade. Growing well in South American gully at Mt. Lofty.
	<i>Jasminum nudiflorum</i>	Winter jasmine	China	A hardy shrub to 2-3mH x2-3mW. In winter the whole plant is covered in bright yellow flowers. Does best in full sun. Prune after flowering.
	<i>Juniperus chinensis</i> ""Pyramidalis""	Chinese juniper	Himalayas, China And Japan	An erect evergreen tree. Deep, light to medium well-drained soil in an open position. Frost resistant but drought tender.
	<i>Laurus nobilis</i>	Sweet Bay	Greece	A small evergreen tree which may be pruned to a shrub, adaptable to most soils. Open, sunny position. Frost resistant but drought tender.
	<i>Liriope muscari</i>		Japan & China	A perennial plant to 0.6mH x 0.5mW with strap-like leaves and deep purple bell-shaped flowers in spikes. Needs a protected, partly shaded position. Frost resistant but drought-tender. Makes a good border or edging.
	<i>Lonicera nitida</i>	Box leaf Honeysuckle		This evergreen shrub makes a magnificent clipped hedge, responds well to regular clipping and can also be used for creating topiaries. Best kept to about 1m in height. Does best in full sun. These plants have been clipped to small balls.
	<i>Lophomyrtus obcordata</i>		New Zealand	An evergreen tree to 5mH x 2m W with open myrtle-like white-petalled flowers. Prefers rich, moist, well-drained soil in a protected, shaded position. Frost resistant when established, but drought tender. May be pruned to shape.
	<i>Luculia pinceana</i>		Himalayas and SW China	An attractive evergreen shrub to 2m x 2m with dense terminal clusters of pale pink tubular flowers, Light to medium well-drained soils in a reasonably protected position. Drought and frost tender. Good specimen near lower car park at Mt. Lofty
	<i>Melaleuca decussata</i>	Honey-myrtle	S. Australia, Victoria	Upright evergreen neat and hardy shrub to 2mH x 2mW with small leaves and small mauve bottle-brush flowers in spring and summer. Suited to most soils and aspects. Good screening plant. Bird attracting.
	<i>Melaleuca elliptica</i>	Granite honey- myrtle	WA	An evergreen shrub to 1mH x 1mW with showy red honey-myrtle flowers with gold tips in spring. Light well-drained soil in an open, sunny position. Frost and drought resistant. Bird attracting.
	<i>Mandevilla laxa</i>	Chilean Jasmine	Argentina	A vigorous twining evergreen vine with pure white flowers to 5cm across in summer. It prefers rich well-drained soil in a partly shaded position. Frost resistant but drought tender.
	<i>Macadamia tetraphylla</i>	Macadamia nut	Queensland, Aus.	A dense evergreen tree which can grow to 20m x 4mW with creamy white flowers and edible nuts. Grows well in Adelaide and environs but needs protection from strong winds whilst young. Frost tender.
	<i>Myrtus communis</i>	Common myrtle	Mediterranean	An evergreen shrub which if not pruned can reach a height of 3-5m. Often clipped into a hedge, it produces masses of white flowers throughout the year, followed by purple berries.

				Leaves have a nice aroma when crushed. Frost resistant.
	<i>Olearia phlogopappa</i>	Dusky daisy bush	NSW, Vic., Tas. Australia	An evergreen shrub approx.. 1.5m x 1.5m with clustered heads of pale blue, daisy flowers in spring. Light to medium well-drained soil in a sunny position. Drought and frost resistant. Butterfly and beneficial insect attracting.
	<i>Ophiopogon jaburan</i> ""Variegatum""	Variegated Mondo grass		Grows in clumps to 30cm H with white flowers Spring-Summer. Best used as a mass planting as a border. Needs full sun to keep the variegated leaves
	<i>Ophiopogon japonicus</i>	Mondo grass	China & Japan	A clumping evergreen perennial plant to 20cm high. Very useful plant for borders or Rock gardens. When mass-planted will out-compete weeds. Adaptable to most soils in sun or shade. Frost resistant but drought-tender.
	<i>Pieris japonica</i>	Japanese Pearl Flower	Japan	An evergreen shrub to 2m x 2m with attractive foliage and beautiful clusters of white, pearl-shaped flowers in dense sprays like lily of the valley in late winter, spring. Prefers cool, acid soils in a protected partially shaded position. Frost resistant, but drought tender.
	<i>Pelargonium crispum</i>		South Africa	An erect, much-branched small shrub to 70cmH.Has lemon-scented, fanshaped leaves. The white to dark pink flowers about 25mm in diameter are single or in clusters of 2 or 3, borne on short peduncles from August to April with a peak in September and October.
	<i>Pelargonium sidoides</i>	S. African geranium	South Africa	Medicinal plant whose root extract is used as a cold and flu medicine. It forms a rosette-like plant with crowded leaves similar to some forms of <i>P. reniforme</i> , but easily distinguished by its blackish rather than pink petals. The long-stalked leaves are mildly aromatic, heart-shaped and velvety. The distinctive dark, reddish-purple flowers are present almost throughout the year, but occur mostly from late spring to summer with a peak in December.
	<i>Pernettya mucronata</i>			A compact bushy evergreen shrub to about 1.2mH with glossy green leaves and white flowers in spring with ornamental berries that can range from white to purple after flowering. Sun or semi-shade. Prune after flowering.
	<i>Podolepis jaceoides</i>		S. Australia	A rare perennial daisy from the Flinders Ranges. It produces multiple large yellow daisy Flowers for much of the year. Prune hard after main flowering. Open position, some summer water. This plant is new to cultivation and looks best mass planted in full sun.
	<i>Rhagodia candolleana</i>	Saltbush	Southern Australia	A small bush with reddish berries from coastal regions. Requires well-drained soil. Good habitat for birds, small mammals and Saltbush Blue Butterfly. Fire resistant.
	<i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i>	Rosemary		This is excellent for topiaries. It develops dense, blue-green foliage that is easily sheared to any shape. Highly fragrant and has many uses in the kitchen. It will grow to 1mH x 1mW.
	<i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i> "Mozart"			A recent introduction of the rosemary tends to have a bushier habit. It flowers for a long period from May to November and is very responsive to regular pruning. Makes an excellent hedge or as a singular specimen in the garden.
	<i>Scaevola crassifolia</i>	Fan flower	W. Australia	An evergreen shrub to about 1m x 1m with blue flowers in summer. Light to medium soils in an open sunny position. Drought hardy but frost tender. Good for coastal planting.
	<i>Scaevola aemula</i>	Fairy Fan flower	Australia	A low, mat-forming perennial plant with blue flowers, mainly in summer. Light to heavy soils in an open, sunny position. Frost and salt-spray resistant. Occasional summer watering.

	<i>Salvia involucrata x karwinskii</i>	Winter lipstick	Mexico Mts.	A large evergreen shrub to 3m x 2m with large spikes of rose-pink flowers in winter. Most soils, some summer moisture. Useful at back of perennial borders. Frost tender.
	<i>Stenocarpus sinuatus</i>	Firewheel tree	NSW, Qld.	Evergreen tree to 30m x 4m in Qld, but less in SA, with glossy green, deeply lobed leaves and spectacular red, wheel-like flowers to 10cm across in late summer or autumn. Medium to heavy well-drained soil in a protected position whilst young. Drought resistant, but better with some summer water. Frost tender. Does well on Adelaide plains.
	<i>Teucrium "Purple Robe"</i>			A low-growing perennial groundcover with purple flowers in summer. Prefers well-drained soil in full sun.
	<i>Ugni mollinae</i>	Chilean guava	Chile	A medium-growing shrub 1-3mH x 1mW with white flowers that hang down, followed by delicious small fruit, purplish in colour. It is a great addition to the garden as a fruit tree or ornamental plant.
	<i>Tibouchina urvilleana</i>	Glory Bush, Lasiandra	South America	An evergreen tree to 5mH x 2mW in good conditions with attractive buds and spectacular purple flowers. Prefers sheltered, moist conditions in good soil. Drought and frost tender.
	<i>Veltheimia bracteata</i>	Forest lily	S. Africa	An unusual bulb with a dense cluster of long lasting pink flowers in spring (similar to Kniphofia) and attractive foliage. Humus-rich well-drained soil in semi-shade. Bulbs die down in summer and re-emerge in autumn.
	<i>Weigela sp.</i>		Japan	An attractive medium shrub with pink flowers. Sunny, open position in well-drained soil.
	<i>Westringia fruticosa</i> (Purple fl. form)	Coastal Rosemary	NSW & Queensland	A dense evergreen shrub from 1-2mH x up to 3m W with purple flowers in summer. Most well-drained soils in open sunny position. Often used as a hedge. Drought and frost resistant, but does better with occasional summer water.

Note: Whilst in nursery pots, plants need to be well-watered daily. Wean gradually after planting out.
