No.	Botanical Name	Common Name	Origin	Label Text
	<i>Acacia gillii</i>		S. Eyre Peninsula Australia	A slender, open shrub or small tree with smooth, grey-brown bark, pendulous branches with globulous golden-yellow flower heads at irregular times throughout the year. Open position in well-drained soil. CS Vulnerable.
	<i>Acacia victoriae</i>	Wattle	NSW, NT, Qld, SA, Vic.,WA	A large rounded evergreen shrub to 3mHx 3mW with pale yellow wattle balls in summer. Medium to heavy soils in an open, sunny position. Drought and frost resistant. Seeds are edible and available commercially, ground and used in cooking, scones, icecream etc.
	<i>Adenanthos x cunninghamii</i>	Small Albany woolly bush	Western Aust.	Was once thought to be a species but now is believed to be a natural hybrid of two <i>Adenanthos</i> species. Small red flowers throughout the year. Bird attracting. A great lower-growing woollybush 1-1.5m by about the same width. Light, well-drained soil in an open sunny position. Frost tender.
	<i>Adenanthos sericeus</i>	Albany woolly bush	Western Aust.	An upright evergreen shrub to about 3mH x 2mW with fine silvery leaves and small bird-attracting flowers. Most well-drained soils. Does well on front-line coast. May be trimmed to make it more dense and popular in pots for Christmas trees which can be brought inside in December.
	<i>Alyxia ruscifolia</i>		SA, NSW & Qld.	This species is a shrub to around 2mH but can get taller. Produces sweetly scented white flowers in spring and summer. Orange berries in autumn. Frost resistant but drought tender. Happy in alkaline or neutral soils and on coast. May be pruned to a neat hedge.
	<i>Araucaria bidwillii</i>	Bunya pine	Queensland, Australia	Tall evergreen conifer from the Jurassic period to 40mH x 10mW. Medium to heavy well-drained soil in a protected position whilst young. Bears large, heavy cones to 7kg with edible nuts. Timber valued by cabinet makers and for acoustic guitar soundboards. Frost resistant and drought tender. For large gardens or parks or as a container plant.
	<i>Begonia cv.</i>			Good indoor plants with attractive leaves and pink flowers.
	<i>Backhousia citriodora</i>	Lemon myrtle	Queensland	An evergreen tree which can grow to 15m in Queensland but can be pruned to a shrub if desired or grown in a pot in a courtyard. Profuse clusters of white flowers in spring and summer. Requires medium to heavy soil in a well-drained, sunny but protected position. Leaves are often used for flavouring food and drinks.
	<i>Baloghia lucida</i>	Brush Bloodwood	NSW, Qld	Evergreen tree to 15m x 2m with glossy green leaves and white flowers 2 cm across in spring. Prefers well-composted soil in a warm position. Drought and frost resistant once established. Its sap was used on Norfolk Island as an indelible dye for marking fibres and for staining the timber of Norfolk Island pine.
	<i>Buddleja myriantha</i>		W. China & Tibet	A beautiful evergreen shrub with violet flowers throughout the year. Will grow 1-3m tall. Cold and heat tolerant and attracts butterflies.
	<i>Brillantaisia ulugurica</i>			A long-flowering plant with striking purple flower spikes in summer. It needs some protection in winter. Full sun or part-shade in our climate and prune flower heads after

				flowering. Can reach 1.5-3m in height.
	<i>Buckinghamia celcissima</i>	Ivory Curl Tree	Queensland	Medium-sized evergreen tree to 7-8m in cultivation, with dark green foliage and spectacular racemes of cream flowers in summer to early winter. Suited to most well-drained soils and conditions but frost and drought tender.
	<i>Bursaria spinosa</i>	SA Christmas bush	Southern Australia	An evergreen shrub with panicles of attractive white flowers in summer and autumn. Acid to mildly alkaline soil in sun or dappled shade. Uses: Screen, butterfly-attracting.
	<i>Buxus microphylla</i> var. <i>japonica</i>	Japanese box	Japan & Taiwan	A compact evergreen shrub which can be used as a formal or informal hedge, barrier or screen. Can be pruned as a low border or left as background screen. Leaves turn bronze in winter.
	<i>Camptotheca acuminata</i>		China & Tibet	A medium sized deciduous tree which can reach 20m in height with the right conditions. The new leaves are a bright red in colour. The bark and stems contain the alkaloid camptothecin, a compound being researched for cancer treatment.
	<i>Chrysanthemum x morifolium</i>	Florist Chrysanthemum		This selection has tight yellow buds that appear in autumn. Can be used in the perennial garden and is also an excellent cut flower. Flowers best in full sun. Cut to the ground in late winter.
	<i>Cornus alba</i> ""Sibirica""	Red stemmed Dogwood		An erect, bushy, deciduous shrub to 1-3mH x 2mW with bright red stems in winter. Coppice every couple of years to keep the intense colour in the stems. The leaves also turn a bright purple in autumn. Flowers are white in spring to summer. Needs full sun and grows in most soil types.
	<i>Cornus sericeus</i> : <i>Flaviramea</i> "	Yellow-stemmed Dogwood		This Dogwood has great autumn foliage that turns a buttercup yellow. Once the leaves fall odd the bright yellow stems are quite a sight. Prune hard every couple of years to keep the colour in the stems. It has nice bushy habit.
	<i>Correa</i> Several species		Australia	Small to medium shrubs approx.. 1.5m x 1.5m usually with red or pink bell-shaped flowers in winter, often tipped with cream or yellow. Prefers well-drained soil in a morning sun or dappled shade position. Dislikes wet feet but needs some summer water in dry periods. Bird attracting.
	<i>Deutzia gracilis</i> ""Nikko""	Japanese snowflower	Japan	A graceful, compact low-growing semi-deciduous shrub to 60cm. with racemes of small white flowers in late spring, early summer. Suited to most soils. Needs some summer water. Sun or part-shade. Frost resistant once established.
	<i>Daphne odora</i>			A spreading evergreen shrub 1mH x 1mW with dark green, leathery leaves and attractive buds which open to reveal splendid, waxy pink flowers with a wonderful fragrance.
	<i>Dianthus caryophyllus</i>	Cheddar Pink	Central Europe	A perennial plant approx.. 0.3mH x 0.5mW with pale to deep pink clove-scented flowers In summer. Light to medium soil in an open, sunny position. Frost resistant. Great for a perennial border.
	<i>Diospyros scabrida</i>	Coastal Bladderwort or Vaswartbas	S. Africa	A quick-growing evergreen shrub to 2-3mH x 1.5-3mW with a compact habit and attractive glossy dark green foliage and white/cream scented flowers. Full sun to semi-shade. Any well-drained soil. Drought resistant and frost-hardy. Often used as a hedge. Grows well at Wittunga Botanic Garden.
	<i>Dyckia enchilioides</i>		S. Brazil	A succulent from the Bromeliad family with orange flowers in spring. 0.8m to 1m H. Full sun

				or light shade in well-drained sand or loam.
	<i>Eremophila maculata</i>	Emu bush	Australia	A neat, hardy, low to medium evergreen shrub with tubular spotted pinkish flowers from autumn to early summer. Suited to most soils. Warm sunny position. Drought hardy. Long-lived. Bird attracting.
	<i>Eremophila</i> "Summertime blue"	<i>E. divaricata x nivea</i>	Australia	Evergreen shrub to 2m x 2m with masses of lavender-blue flowers in summer. Well-drained clay or loam soils. Full sun to part shade. Needs little water after establishment on Adelaide plains. Clip lightly after flowering.
	<i>Euonymus alatus</i> "Compactus"			One of the best plants for bright red autumn colour. A smaller-growing shrub 1-3mH x 1-2mW. A compact habit and a great feature plant in autumn.
	<i>Euonymus fortunei x radicans</i>		China	Attractive foliage plant with variegated leaves which makes a great hedge or may be grown as a single specimen in full sun. Responds well to regular pruning.
	<i>Euryops pectinatus</i>			A vigorous evergreen shrub to 1.5mH. Drought hardy with bright yellow daisy flowers throughout the year and attractive silver foliage. Responds well to pruning after flowering. A great addition to the garden.
	<i>Flindersia australis</i>	Australian Teak	NSW & Qld	Often used here as an indoor plant but needs to be refreshed outside from time to time.
	<i>Forsythia intermedia</i>			A vigorous medium deciduous shrub with an amazing display of golden yellow flowers in spring. Moist alkaline, acid or neutral soils in an open sunny or part-shaded position.
	<i>Fuchsia procumbens</i>	Trailing fuchsia	New Zealand	Prefers rich, moist soil in a shady, sheltered position.
	<i>Fuchsia coccinea</i>	Scarlet Fuchsia	Brazil	A fast-growing shrub that can vary in habit according to its habitat. In good conditions in shade it can grow up to 3.5mH, but is best pruned after flowering. It bears scarlet flowers, mainly in summer and requires fertile, well-drained neutral soil. Some shade in summer is useful but plenty of light is needed in winter. The fruit is edible. Frost and drought tender.
	<i>Gardenia sp.</i>			A wonderful perfumed shrub that produces pure white double flowers throughout the year. Does best with protection from sun, as well as the flowers. Sheltered position with neutral to acid soil. A great plant with a bushy habit for a pot.
	<i>Goodenia ovata</i>		Australia	A hardy low-growing groundcover to .05m x 1m with golden yellow flowers in spring and summer. Quick-growing in most soils. Shade or morning sun. Frost hardy. Ideal for rockeries, edges, hanging baskets.
	<i>Goodenia varia</i>		Australia	Very hardy groundcover with yellow flowers most of the year. Sun or part shade. Suited to pots, hanging baskets, courtyards. Drought hardy.
	<i>Grewia occidentalis</i>	Four Corners	S.Africa	An evergreen shrub to 4mH x 3mW. With elm-like leaves and mauve-pink 5 petalled flowers 3cm across. Light to medium soil in a protected, sunny position. Drought and frost tender.
	<i>Hardenbergia violacea</i>	Purple Coral Pea	SE Australia	A vigorous evergreen twining vine with clusters of purple pea-shaped flowers in spring. Suited to most well-drained soils in an open, sunny position. Drought & frost resistant. Butterfly attracting.
	<i>Hebe hartii</i>	Veronica	NZ	A clump-forming hardy perennial 0.5-1mH with clusters of white flowers in late spring and early summer followed by conspicuous seed capsules. Suited to most well-drained soils.

	<i>Jasminum nudiflorum</i>	Winter jasmine	China	A hardy shrub to 2-3mH x2-3mW. In winter the whole plant is covered in bright yellow flowers. Does best in full sun. Prune after flowering.
	<i>Jovellana violacea</i>		Chile	An upright mound-forming shrub 1.5-2m h x 0.5mw with clusters of lilac flowers in Spring/Summer. Full sun to part shade in well drained soil. Protect from heavy frost. Unusual plant, rare in cultivation. Ideal potted plant. May be grown in a pot in good light indoors.
	<i>Juniperus procumbens</i>		Asia	An evergreen semi-prostrate shrub which can grow to 3mHx 4mW with finer greyish-green leaves. It prefers light to medium well-drained soil in an open position. Frost resistant but drought tender.
	<i>Kunzea pomifera</i>	Muntries	Australia	A, prostrate spreading shrub which produces white flowers and small sweet edible apple-like fruits. Often trained on a trellis for commercial fruit production. Grows naturally on sand dunes on Fleurieu Peninsula and around the coast but will also grow on plains and hills in well-drained soil.
	<i>Libertia chilensis</i>	Satin flower		A clump-forming hardy perennial 0.5-1mH with clusters of white flowers in late spring and early summer followed by conspicuous seed capsules. Suited to most well-drained soils. Do not plant near bushland.
	<i>Liriope muscari</i>		Japan & China	A low perennial plant to 0.6mH x 0.5mW with strap-like leaves and deep purple bell-shaped flowers in spikes Needs a protected, partly shaded position. Frost resistant but drought tender. Makes a good border or edging.
	<i>Lonicera nitida</i>	Box leaf Honeysuckle		This evergreen shrub makes a magnificent clipped hedge, responds well to regular clipping and can also be used for creating topiaries. Best kept to about 1m in height. Does best in full sun. These plants have been clipped to small balls.
	<i>Melaleuca elliptica</i>	Granite honey-myrtle	WA	An evergreen shrub to 1mH x 1mW with showy red honey-myrtle flowers with gold tips in spring. Light well-drained soil in an open, sunny position. Frost and drought resistant. Bird attracting.
	<i>Murraya paniculata</i>	Orange jessamine		A small tropical evergreen tree or shrub to 2-5m tall which flowers throughout the year. The flowers are dense and fragrant and the fruit is fleshy, oblong-ovoid coloured red to orange and grows up to 2.5cm in length. It makes an excellent hedge and responds to regular pruning.
	<i>Oregano vulgare</i>	Herb	Mediterranean	A well-known perennial herb
	<i>Myrtus communis</i>	Common myrtle	Mediterranean	An evergreen shrub which if not pruned can reach a height of 3-5m. Often clipped into a hedge, it produces masses of white flowers throughout the year, followed by purple berries. Leaves have a nice aroma when crushed. Frost resistant.
	<i>Olearia scillionensis</i>	Perrenial daisy		A evergreen shrub with small leaves and masses of white daisy flowers. Well-drained soil in an open position. Good in perennial borders.
	<i>Ophiopogon jaburan</i> ""Variegatum""	Variegated Mondo grass		Grows in clumps to 30cm H with white flowers Spring-Summer. Best used as a mass planting as a border. Needs full sun to keep the variegated leaves

	<i>Ophiopogum japonicans</i>	Mondo grass	China & Japan	A clumping evergreen perennial plant to 20cm high. Very useful for borders or rock gardens. When mass-planted will out-compete weeds. Adaptable to most soils in sun or shade. Frost resistant but drought tender.
	<i>Ozmanthos fragrans</i>	Sweet Osmanthos	Himalayas, China & Japan	An evergreen shrub about 2-4mH x 1-2mW with an exceptional strong perfume. The flowers can be used in tea to infuse the lovely aroma. It is relatively cold and drought hardy and responds well to regular pruning. The new growth is a lovely red colour.
	<i>Pieris formosa</i>			An evergreen shrub 1-4mH with white flowers in spring. It belongs to the Ericaceae family and prefers acid soil. Best in a protected semi-shade position. Prune after flowering to keep a nice bushy habit.
	<i>Pieris japonica</i>	Japanese Pearl Flower	Japan	An evergreen shrub to 2m x 2m with attractive foliage and beautiful clusters of white, pearl-shaped flowers in dense sprays like lily of the valley in late winter, spring. Prefers cool, acid soils in a protected partially shaded position. Frost resistant, but drought tender.
	<i>Pernettya mucronata</i>		Straits of Magellan, South America	A compact bushy evergreen shrub to about 1.2mH with glossy green leaves and white flowers in spring with ornamental berries that can range from white to purple after flowering. Sun or semi-shade. Prune after flowering.
	<i>Rhagodia candolleana</i>	Saltbush	Southern Australia	A small bush with reddish berries from coastal regions. Requires well-drained soil. Good habitat for birds, small mammals and Saltbush Blue Butterfly. Fire resistant.
	<i>Salvia</i> ""Anthony Parker""			A larger-growing Salvia that can get above 1mH. It produces large purple flower spikes with lots of flowers over a long period of time. Bird and bee attracting and a great addition to the perennial border.
	<i>Salvia leucantha</i>	Mexican mint bush		An evergreen shrub to 0.6mH x 1mW with bright purple tubular flowers in winter. Light to medium well-drained soil in an open, sunny position. Drought and frost resistant
	<i>Sarcococca hookeriana</i> var. <i>humilis</i>	Dwarf Sweet Box	China	A small suckering shrub to 60cmH forming a nice neat clump. Flowers are creamy white with a sweet aroma. Flowering in winter, it makes a great small hedge or a feature plant.
	<i>Scaevola aemula</i>	Fairy Fan flower	Australia	A low, mat-forming perennial plant with blue flowers, mainly in summer. Light to heavy soils in an open, sunny position. Frost and salt-spray resistant. Occasional summer watering.
	<i>Strelitzia reginae</i>	Crane flower	S. Africa	An evergreen shrub to 1.5mH x 1.5mW with striking ""Bird of Paradise"" orange & purple flowers. Light to medium well-drained soil in an open position.
	<i>Salvia involucrata</i> x <i>karwinskii</i>	Winter lipstick	Mexico Mts.	A large evergreen shrub to 3m x 2m with large spikes of rose-pink flowers in winter. Most soils, some summer moisture. Useful at back of perennial borders. Frost tender.
	<i>Teucrium fruticans</i>	Bush Germander	S. Europe	An evergreen shrub with silver-grey leaves to 1.2mH x 1.5mW with blue tubular flowers. Prefers a well-drained open position. Drought resistant but frost tender. Sometimes pruned to a low hedge.
	<i>Ternstroemia gymnanthera</i>		SE Asia	Evergreen tree to 5m x 2.5mW. with white flowers and clusters of red berries. Prefers cool. Light, well-drained acid soils in a warm position. Frost resistant but drought tender.
	<i>Ugni mollinae</i>	Chilean guava	Chile	A medium-growing shrub 1-3mH x 1mW with white flowers that hang down, followed by delicious small fruit, purplish in colour. It is a great addition to the garden as a fruit tree or

				ornamental plant.
	<i>Tarcchananthos comphoratus</i>	Camphor bush	Africa	A semi-deciduous small tree or shrub from 2 to 9m high from dry, inland gardens in the north of Africa with pale grey narrow leaves., creamy-white terminal, scented, flowers. It has many medicinal uses. The leaves can also be used for massaging body stiffness and as a perfume. Drought and frost hardy and can shoot from the base after fire.
	<i>Veltheimia bracteata</i>	Forest lily	S. Africa	An unusual bulb with a dense cluster of long lasting pink flowers in spring (similar to Kniphofia) and attractive foliage. Humus-rich well-drained soil in semi-shade. Bulbs die down in summer and re-emerge in autumn.
	<i>Westringia fruticosa</i> (Purple fl. form)	Coastal Rosemary	NSW & Queensland	A dense evergreen shrub from 1-2mH x up to 3m W with purple flowers in summer. Most well-drained soils in open sunny position. Often used as a hedge. Drought and frost resistant, but does better with occasional summer water.

Note: Whilst in nursery pots, plants need to be well-watered daily. Wean gradually after planting out.
